On Sunday, May 15, 2011, the Richmond Times-Dispatch published "Tri Club Woman's Club tabulates donations" in the Moneywise Section. This article was submitted to Notablegifts@timesdispatch.com of the Richmond Times-Dispatch by **Mary-Meade Lee**, first Vice President, Leadership. "Members of Tri Club Woman's Club, GFWC, contributed 3,727 volunteer hours, \$9,820 of donations such as food items, lap blankets and helmet liners, and \$10,847 in monetary donations in 2010. Recipients include McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center, Fisher House, Ronald McDonald House, Ridge Elementary School, Crestview Elementary School, Prevent Child Abuse Virginia, Maymont Foundation, HOBY Foundation, Virginia Breast Cancer Foundation, Camp Comfort Zone, Lamb's Basket, Autism Awareness, Operation Christmas Child, World Food Day, Southern Sudan Project, Plan USA, UNICEF, Operation Smile, USO Project, American Red Cross and Safe Harbor.

Tri Club is a member of Lee District, GFWC Virginia and the General Federation of Woman's Clubs, one of the world's largest and oldest woman's volunteer community-service organizations."

**West End Community Center:**

The Center suffered no damage from the earthquake and had no loss of power during the hurricane.

We have repaired a small plumbing problem with the pipes under the kitchen sink. After the replacement of exterior light bulbs, we recruited **Martha Vermilya** to keep an eye on the Center at night so we will know when light bulbs burn out. The porch lights and the sign lights are on timers. The floodlights are photosensitive and come on after dark. To test in the daytime

whether the floodlight bulb is working, we have to cover the photosensitive cell with heavy tape and a thick item such as a work glove, and then wait at least ten minutes for the "darkness" to register and turn on the light.

We have unbundled the telephone service and reduced our phone bills.

"THE GLASS ROOM"  
by Simon Mawer**

"THE GLASS ROOM" is a thing of extraordinary beauty and a novel of ideas, yet strongly propelled by plot.

Honeymooners Viktor And Liesel Laudouer are filled with the vibrant optimism of central Europe of the 1920s when they meet modernist architect Rainer von Abt. He builds them a home to embody their exuberant faith in the future, and the Landauer House becomes an instant masterpiece. Viktor and Liesel, a rich Jewish mogul and a thoughtful, modern gentile, pour all their hopes for their marriage and budding family into their stunning home, filling it with a generation of artists and thinkers eager to renounce old world European style in favor of the avant-garde. But their new home also brings out their most ardent desires and darkest secrets, and soon the radiant honesty and idealism of 1930 quickly evaporates beneath the storm clouds of World War II.

As Nazi troops enter the country, the family must abandon their old life style and attempt to escape to America before Viktor's Jewish roots draw Nazi attention, and before the family dissolves.

Brimming with barely contained passion and cruelty, the precision of science, the wild variance of lust, the catharsis of confession, and the fear of failure, the "Glass Room" contains it all.

**LEGISLATION: GRACIE TINGLE  
DID YOU MISS:**

The Obama administration announced they would allow illegal immigrants facing deportation to stay in the US and apply for a work permit while focusing on the deportation of the ones who are convicted criminals and those who might be a threat to national security or public safety. Remember, the Dream Cat did not pass in Congress and this new deportation plan is so similar that the critics are saying it is back door amnesty for illegal immigrants.

The House refused to delay the new U.S.-Canada pipeline since Trans-Canada had already met the safety guidelines. (HR 1938) Trans-Canada wants to build a pipeline to carry an estimated 700,000 barrels of crude oil from Alberta to refineries in Texas. Supporters claim by doubling the existing capacity it would significantly reduce our dependency on Middle East oil. Environmental groups have been protesting outside the White House. The third environmental analysis submitted by the State Department since last year reported that the project is unlikely to cause significant environmental problems during construction. The State Department approval of this project has remained pending for three years.

Now, the State Department kicks off a 90-day review to see if the project is in the "national interest." A final decision will be determined this year. If approved by Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, completion of the pipeline could be by 2013. The State Department has authority over this project since it crosses international lines. *Wonder why some things take so long to get done in Washington?*

On the health care issue here in Richmond, the 4th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals decision ruled not on the merits of Obamacare

but ruled that Virginia lacks the standing to sue. Put simply, it means a different plaintiff is needed.

The U.S. has fallen further down a global ranking of the world's most competitive economies. The World Economic Forum announced we are ranked in fifth place this year. We were in fourth place last year after dropping from No.1 in 2008.

It appears that the Safe Highways and Infrastructure Preservation Act, which we have been following, has died in committee. I will continue to check in case this bill resurfaces.
